Call for Workshop Proposals

Following the tradition of previous UML Conferences, UML 2004 will host a number of workshops. The workshops will provide a collaborative forum for a group of (typically 15 to 30) participants to exchange recent or preliminary results, to conduct intensive discussions on a particular topic, or to coordinate efforts between representatives of a technical community.

In particular, each workshop should provide a balanced distribution of its time for both, presentation of papers, thus favouring the attendance of young researchers, and discussion. We encourage prospective workshop organizers to submit proposals for highly-interactive workshops focusing on either in-depth analysis or broad-ranging approaches to areas related to UML and modeling in general. Topics in both research and/or applications are welcome.
